UNI MEI Resolution in Support for Changes to the *Law on Exercising Public Interest in Culture in Slovenia*

Dear Prime Minister,
Dear Ministers,

UNI MEI Global Union represents over 140 media and entertainment unions worldwide. During its world General Assembly, which took place in Lisbon on 28 October 2015, UNI MEI and its affiliated broadcasting and live performance workers unions have adopted a resolution in support for changes to the *Law on Exercising Public Interest in Culture in Slovenia*.

The Resolution calls on the Government of the Republic of Slovenia to support and back the proposed changes of the *Law on Exercising Public Interest in Culture (ZUJIK)*, and notably the changes introduced by the Ministry of Culture of the Republic of Slovenia, which seek to improve the position of freelancers and self-employed workers in culture.
